Are power banks allowed in checked luggage?

Power banks are only allowed in carry-on bags, never in checked luggage. Up to 100Wh (?27,000mAh) is permitted without airline approval. Power banks rated 101-160Wh require prior airline approval. The FAA and TSA ban uninstalled lithium-ion batteries in checked baggage.

Can you bring a power bank on a plane?

Always pack your power bank in your carry-on --they're not allowed in checked luggage. Batteries under 100 watt-hours (Wh) are automatically allowed. This covers most standard phone and tablet power banks. If your charger is between 100 and 160 Wh, you can bring up to two--but you'll need approval from the airline before you board.

There are strict guidelines for traveling by air with batteries and power banks. This is primarily due to safety concerns associated with their lithium-ion batteries. These batteries can pose a fire risk if they malfunction or are damaged.
