How are customs tariffs calculated in Montenegro?

Tariffs range from zero to 30 percent. Customs tariffs are not calculated on exported goods. Montenegro is a member of the Central European Free Trade Agreement (CEFTA). Import duties are set by the customs tariff, as an integral part of the Customs Tariff Law, which is fully based on terms harmonized with EU legislation.

What is Montenegro's trade policy?

Trade policy is characterized by a low level of custom duties and the absence of non-tariff trade barriers. The tariff system is prescribed by the Law on Customs Tariffs. Tariffs range from zero to 30 percent. Customs tariffs are not calculated on exported goods. Montenegro is a member of the Central European Free Trade Agreement (CEFTA).

How is VAT paid in Montenegro?

VAT on imports is paid along with customs duties to the Customs Authorities. Customs duties are paid on goods imported into the customs territory of Montenegro in accordance with the rates and tariffs set forth in the Customs Tariffs, which is in line with the harmonised system of tariff codes prescribed by the World Trade Organisation (WTO).

Is Montenegro a member of CEFTA?

Montenegro is a member of the Central European Free Trade Agreement (CEFTA). Import duties are set by the customs tariff, as an integral part of the Customs Tariff Law, which is fully based on terms harmonized with EU legislation.
